Report

The Department of Philosophy, Christ Church College, Kanpur in association with Indian Council of Philosophical Research, New Delhi, organized **two (02) Lectures** under the Periodical Lecture Scheme of the Council on **February 07, 2019 and February 20, 2019** respectively in the college seminar room.

First Lecture Programme

The first periodical lecture titled "**Contemporary Trends in Population Growth: Socio-Philosophical Implications**" was delivered by Dr. Arun Kumar Sharma, Professor of the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur on February 07, 2019. In his lecture, Dr. A.K. Sharma raised concerns on the globally pertinent issue of population explosion. In our own country, the population has reached 1.37 billion and is growing at the rate of 1.4 percent per year, despite the fact that the women of India are producing only 2.3 children in their life time. The alarming rate of growth of population cannot be reduced much through government interventions. Old systems had their own ways to solve their problems. New and sudden changes are likely to create confusion.

Pointing to the demographic changes of our society, Dr. Sharma said that with the increase in life expectancy there are a burgeoning number of senior citizens above the age of 65. What do you do with the old people suddenly?

While addressing the financial and educational aspirations of the teeming youth, we also have to provide social security, healthcare and a life of dignity to the old people. Also you need not only money, but also social support for money. All these issues are changing the dynamics in families, societies and governmental thrust and action. This lecture raised some social and philosophical questions about the possible effects of new trends in population.

The lecture was followed by a Question Answer session in which the enlightened audience participated animatedly. More than 50 teaching faculty and research scholars from several colleges participated in the Lecture. This lecture programme was chaired by Dr. R.K. Gupta, Principal of Christ Church College. Dr. D. Second Lecture Programme





Lecture on ethics and epics held

KANPUR: The Department of Philosophy, Christ Church College organised a periodical lecture series under the sponsorship of Indian Council of Philosophical Research, New

Delhi on Wednesday. The second lecture of the series was delivered by Dr. Vineet Sahu, Professor of Philosophy, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT Kanpur. The topic of the lecture was

Ethics and Epics: A Civilizational Interrogation.

The programme was chaired by Dr RK Gupta, Principal, Christ Church College. Dr DC Srivastava, Head, Department of Philosophy and convener of the programme welcomed the main speaker and the guests.

main speaker in his lecture argued that epics (as a genre) are the fertile conceptual resources for extracting and extracting philosophical perspectives that may provide a more grounded and rooted introduction to ethical problems. He said that Epic, in both western and eastern world, are definitely our common stage and have relevance in more ways than apparent. He said that the *Iliad* and the *Odyssey* mark the development of thinking in the west, as do epics in India like *Mahabharata* and *Ramayana* forms the basis of our culture. He said that epics like *Ramayana* and *Mahabharata* have captivated the minds and imagination of Indians for centuries with their soul searching questions, problems, doubts and dilemmas. Revered and treasured in households throughout the country, they have a timeless relevance in this contemporary ever changing world. He said that epics are an ideological text which we regard it as pure and beyond criticism. He summed up Epic in Paul Feyerabend words which include two phrases, 'surpassing' and 'dimension of realising' and including history represent the two poles within which we place the experience described as 'epic'. He added that the double relation of epic to history on one hand

and to everyday reality to the other, and to make clearly two of the most important original functions. It was a chronicle and at the same time a story book for general entertainment. He said that epics may also be seen as a civilisational master plot—a public distillation of the various theories that populate a civilisational history. He said that epics have been retold and over time the legends and each new version may be regarded as novel attempt to resolve the dilemma inherent in the original version. He then switched to oral tradition. He said that oral tradition is solid part of human knowledge. He pointed out that oral tradition may be a stronger oral tradition because the texts are 'alive', alive to the context of oral tradition incorporates the context, as far as narrative content of self is concerned. Vinod said, as we understand ourselves, it is important to understand the stories. He added the stories should cultivate spirit of a person instead emphasizing on the facts. According to Dr Subh, Epics as a genre provide grounded and rooted solution to moral dilemmas, ethical problems we face in lives. They contain insight, social behaviour and ethical framework, down the ages. Subh concluded that epics as a rich stimuli for every citizen to interrogate itself to attain clarity on lives. He added that profoundness of epics can be tapped to bring moral philosophy to be conceptually rich and contextually connected.
