Programs Organised

The Gender Sensitization and Women Development Cell of Christ Church College, Kanpur, organized two significant events during the session 2023-24 to increase awareness on gender sensitization and provide self-defense training to the students. Event 1: Two-Day Self-Defense Training Program

Objective:

The event concluded with the felicitation of students who performed exceptionally well.











Event 2: Lecture on "Gender Sensitization"

Objective:

The lecture aimed to raise awareness about gender sensitization, addressing gender discrimination and related issues prevalent in society.

Details of the Event:

The lecture was held in Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan Auditorium under the guidance of Prof. Joseph Daniel, Principal and Secretary of the college, on the occasion of International Women's Day. Dr. Anshu Yadav, Professor and Dean of the School of Management, CSJM University, was the keynote speaker. The program was conducted by Dr. Ankita Jasmine Lall and began with a prayer led by Vice Principal Prof. Sabina Bodra.
